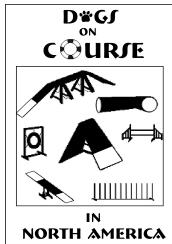

2018 North America Challenge - For anyone entering the North America Challenge, Dogs that are competing DOCNA Specialist Standard, or in Standard Agility at the Elite Level in NADAC, Masters or Performance III in USDAA, Excellent in AKC, Level 4/5/C in CPE etc, must enter the North America Challenge at the Specialist Level in the Division they are choosing to run in Competition, Select, Veteran, Jr. Handler or Grand Veterans

The Junior Handler Division is geared towards encouraging younger handlers to be involved in the sport. Jump heights are reduced to 4", 8", 12", 16" and 20" in the Junior Handler Division. No double or triple jumps may be used. Standard course time for the Junior Handler Division will be 15% more than the Competition Division standard course times in each event.

Entry Eligibility

Any physically capable dog handled by a competitor who is between the ages of 7 and 16 years of age may enter the Junior Handler Division.

While we generally believe that 7-8 years of age is the optimal age for a handler to start competing, we also recognize that there are some exceptional kids who may be ready to compete earlier than 7 years of age. Competitors who are younger than 7, but have titled a dog in another venue may also enter this division. In addition, any parent/guardian who feels strongly that their child is ready to compete may contact DOCNA (www.docna.com) and provide information on age of child, training that their child has done, experience of their child, experience of the child's dog, etc, and DOCNA will review the situation and approve on a case by case basis.

Juniors (ages 7 and older) may compete in other divisions and will be given same SCT as posted.

Physically Challenged Dogs

Physically Challenged Dogs mainly includes, but is not limited to, canine amputees, visually or hearing compromised dogs. Our primary concern is for the safety of the dog. We acknowledge that canine health encompasses both the physical and the mental aspects of life. Physically challenged dogs that may otherwise be in good health and that display the desire and ability to safely execute required obstacle performances are welcome to enter and compete.

Entry Eligibility:

Canine amputees should acquire a letter from their veterinarian stating that the dog is capable of competing in agility and that the dog will not likely suffer any long term affects above and beyond what might be normal for dogs that engage in this sport. The letter should be available on request for view by the judge or trial committee. They shall be awarded GRAND VETERAN status regardless of age; and will be subject to the applicable rules of the Grand Veteran division. Officers of DOCNA, and/or their designated appointee at a trial (judge and/or trial committee) reserve the right to excuse/dismiss a dog from competition that appears to be in obvious pain or discomfort and/or to designate that a dog be limited to specific classes and/or be placed under a jump height restriction. The owner of the dog may appeal a judge's/appointee's trial decision to the DOCNA offices for a binding ruling.

Physically Challenged Dogs that have visual or hearing challenges but have demonstrated the ability to perform at a higher level by either having competed in another venue or have completed training that establishes the team as safe to compete physically at a higher level are approved to compete in the division that they are eligible for, but they may decide to compete as a Grand Veteran if they so choose.

Disabled/Handicapped Designation

Dogs On Course in North America, LLC is providing a special designation for disabled/handicapped exhibitors. Such exhibitors will be allowed extra time for qualifying purposes only. There will be a place on the entry form to designate this category. When entering as a disabled/handicapped handler, it is required that you enter all events with this designation. Dogs entered with handlers in this category will still be placed with the dogs jump height. The best time/most points will always place higher. **DOCNA trusts that only exhibitors who have documented medical conditions will enter this category.**

Disabled/handicapped handlers will receive additional time in titling events.

LEVELS

Beginner

The Beginner level is the first experience level in all divisions. Its purpose is to offer a successful experience and a reasonable level of challenge for the beginning dog.

Within each division and titling event, the Beginner level is open to any dog that is at least 12 months old who has not recorded a qualifying round in the Specialist level for that titling event. Dogs may move back one level but not two (you cannot move to beginner level in any titling event after achieving a qualifying round at the specialist level in that same titling event). Dogs may not move up to the Intern level until they have earned a certificate of merit (title) for that titling event (exception is the experience grand-fathering clause if applicable).

Intern

The Intern level is the middle experience level in all divisions. Its purpose is to offer challenges that demonstrate dog responsiveness on obstacles and competitor confidence with a variety of handling techniques at a greater rate of speed.

Within each division and titling class, the Intern level is open to any dog that has earned a certificate of merit (title) at the Beginner Level for that titling event and is at least 15 months old. Dogs at the Intern level may move back one level to Beginner if it is desired. Dogs may not move up to the Specialist level until they have earned a certificate of merit (title) for that titling event (exception is the experience grandfathering clause if applicable).

Specialist

The Specialist level is the top experience level in all divisions. Its purpose is to offer ****advanced**** agility challenges that require a variety of handling techniques and demonstrate dog and handler teamwork at the highest rate of speed.

Within each division and titling event, the Specialist level is open to any dog that has earned a certificate of merit (title) at the Intern Level for that titling event and is at least 15 months old. Dogs at the Specialist level may move back one level to Intern if it is desired, but they may not move back more than one level (to Beginner).

Jump Heights & Measuring

Owners are responsible for entering the proper jump height division. Measuring will be from 3pm to 5pm on Friday and 6:30 to 7:30 on Saturday and Sunday. Dogs entered requiring measuring must be available for measurement **BEFORE** 7:30 am.

Any dog that measures within ½ inch of their jump height cutoff will require an official measurement by the show judge of record in order for the dog to be allowed to compete unless the owner/handler can show that they have completed the requirements of the measurement form or obtained a permanent height card from DOCNA.

There are five (5) jump heights in the Competition Division; they are 8", 12", 16", 20", and 24".

Select, *Veterans, and Junior Handler's Divisions jump heights are 4", 8", 12", 16", and 20". Grand Veterans jump heights are 4", 8", 12", and 16". (see full rules at www.docna.com page 10) * It is important veteran handlers view the rule pertaining to Veteran Dog opportunity.

*Veteran Dog Opportunity

DOCNA recognizes not all veteran dogs will age at the same level; some dogs may require additional assistance as they grow older. Those Competitors/Handlers entering the Veteran Division that feel their dog may require additional time and that a lower jump height would be in the best interest of their dog and are not using this assistance just to obtain a competitive advantage, may choose to jump their dog 4 inches lower than the official Veteran Heights.

In determining the jump heights of the Grand Veterans Division, DOCNA where possible has given the Competitors/Handlers entering the Grand Veterans Division the opportunity to jump their dog as close to 50% of the dog's measured Competition Height.

Handler's may always choose to jump their dog higher, but will be placed and have the Standard Course Time (SCT) of the dogs in that higher height. The following heights are not available to move up to in DOCNA jump heights: Select 24 inch, Veteran 24 inch, Grand Veteran 20 inch and Jr. Handler 24 inch.

If a handler chooses to have a dog jump higher than his measured/registered jump height the equivalent Competition Jump Height for that new chosen height is used. For example a dog measured to run 16 inch in Competition runs 16 in select instead of the usual 12 -- the SCT used will be the SCT for the 20 inch height. (Measured Competition Division Height + 4) SCT + XX% (Division) = time

If a handler chooses to have a dog jump lower than his measured/registered jump height as allowed in Veterans only, the equivalent Competition Jump Height for that chosen height is used. For example, a dog measured to run 16 inches in Competition runs 8 in Veterans instead of the usual 12 -- the SCT used will be the SCT for a 12 inch dog.

(Measured Competition Division Height - 4) SCT + XX% (Division) = time

Walk Thrus

The judge may have all levels walk (i.e. Intern) of all divisions (i.e. Competition, Select, Veteran, Grand Veteran and Junior Handler). It is the responsibility of the handler to be aware and make necessary arrangements to attend all walk thrus.

In Snakes and Ladders or Trigility judge may have all levels and divisions prior to commencing with the first dog on the line. In addition, the judge may walk all heights of a division (example Select all Heights), or one level of all divisions (example Specialist). It is the responsibility of the handler to be aware and make necessary arrangements to attend all walk thrus.

The judge may have all levels walk Specialist and Intern together for either Traditional or Strategic Gamblers events if the course allows this ability. It is the responsibility of the handler to be aware and make necessary arrangements to attend all walk thrus.

The order of classes will be as follows:

Saturday: Ring #1 (tall to small)

Traditional Time Gamble – Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)
Standard Rd 1 – Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)
Standard Rd 2 – Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)
Snakes 'N Ladders - Beginner Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Specialist Level (all divisions)
Jumpers – Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)

Sunday: Ring #1 (small to tall)

Trigility - Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)
Strategic Time Gamble - Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions), Beginner Level (all divisions)
North America Challenge – Specialist Level (all divisions), Intern Level (all divisions)

This order is subject to change after entries close.

Description of Events being offered

Standard Agility Event - Standard Agility will challenge the handler /dog team with both work away sections and close proximity handling challenges. The handler/dog team must demonstrate the ability of the team to perform a variety of obstacles on the course while working as a smooth functioning team. All obstacles must be performed without fault and the team must meet the Standard Course Time requirements of the division and level

.Jumpers - Jumpers is an opportunity for the dog and handler team to maneuver through a course of jumps at a very fast pace. The only obstacles on a Jumpers Course are JUMPS. Jumpers Courses will challenge the handler /dog team and have both work away sections and close proximity handling challenges.

Traditional Gamblers - Traditional Gamble is an event that allows the handler/dog team to plan their own course, obtaining points along the way for completing obstacles up to 2 times each successfully for the specified opening period of time. At the end of the point accumulation period, the dog must successfully complete a work away challenge (gamble) at the required distance for level and division, and then stop the clock for time. The handler/dog team must be successful in both parts of this event to qualify.

Strategic Time Gamble - Strategic Time Gamble is an event that allows the handler/dog team to plan their own course, obtaining points along the way for completing obstacles up to 2 times each successfully. There are two (2) parts to this event, a point accumulation period (opening) and a strategic gamble period (closing); the handler plans a course that will allow the dog to cross the finish line at as close to maximum time without going over. The handler/dog team must be successful in both parts of this event in order to qualify.

Snakes N' Ladders - Snakes N' Ladders is a strategic game that has tunnels, contact equipment and weaves. The weaves requirement at the beginner level includes 3 sets of 5- 6 weave poles. At the Intern and Specialist Level the competitor is required to perform 1 set of 10-12 weaves, and 2 sets of 5- 6 weave poles. The handler strategically plans their course, with the goal being to complete all the contact and weave obstacles and cross the finish line as quickly as possible. **All dogs must start at the Beginner level in the Snakes 'N Ladders.**

Trigility - Trigility is a team strategy game that tests the agility ability of the 3 members of the team to complete 3 types of agility on a regular agility course. The goal is to complete all 3 courses in the shortest amount of time and to have one team member successfully complete a mini gamble test. **All dogs must start at the Beginner level in Trigility.**

North America Challenge Event – Championship Qualifiers - The North America Challenge Event will be the standard for qualification into future championships. This is a special agility run that is scored under the same rules and SCT as Standard Agility with the exception that off courses are judged as elimination. North America Challenge Events will be more technically challenging courses. Each course will include 1 set of 10-12 weaves and may include an additional set of 5-6 weaves for all levels. In addition, courses may include the performance of 4 contact obstacles, multiple side changes, and additional discriminations.

The North America Challenge is a special event which gives the handler and dog team the opportunity to compete in the DOCNA championships in 2007. For anyone entering the North America Challenge, Dogs that are competing in Standard Agility at the Elite Level in Nadac, Masters in USDAA, Excellent in AKC, etc, must enter the North America Challenge at the Specialist Level in the Division they are choosing to run in Competition, Select, Veteran, Jr. Handler or Grand Veterans.

All other competitors should enter at the Intern Level (this includes beginners).

The handler will then *enter the Division they are choosing to run in Competition, Select, Veteran, Jr. Handler or Grand Veterans at the Intern level.*

Directions to Show Site

The show will be held at the Contact Zonies training site at the Melrose Swim Club, 11424 N. 30th St., Phoenix, AZ 85028

From the North: Take US51 south to Cactus exit. Go west on Cactus to 30th Street. South (left) on 30th Street to site.

From South: Take US51 north to 32nd Street exit. Go north on 32nd Street to Cholla. Turn west (left) on Cholla to 30th Street. Turn north (right) on 30th Street to site.

Food, Restrooms, & Emergency Vet Information:

There will NOT be a food vendor on site. Workers will be provided with food and drinks. Additionally, there are many fast food restaurants along 32nd Street near Cactus.

WEATHER

Winter in Arizona means cooler overnight and early morning temperatures. It does occasionally rain in Arizona. Please bring your own shelter/canopy for protection from the sun and elements.

AWARDS

Dogs On Course in North America, LLC; will offer Ribbons for First through Fourth place in each class for each jump height class. Ribbons in the DOCNA colors of Red, White and Blue will be offered to every dog obtaining a qualifying score.

First through Third place ribbons will be presented in the North America Challenge for each jump height class and level. Every dog obtaining a qualifying score in the North America Challenge will earn a North America Challenge Teal Qualifying Ribbon

CLUB RULES FOR THE TRIAL

- Contact Zonies Dog Agility Club, reserves the right to refuse any entry. Every entrant must be in good standing with DOCNA.
- Please take responsibility for your dogs and children. Any exhibitor whose dogs or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked by the Trial Committee to leave the trial site.
- No entry will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riot, civil disobedience, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- Contact Zonies sets a withdrawal from the trial after closing date due to an injury and/or illness to the dog will be eligible for a refund up to 100% of the total entry fee paid. A veterinarian's notice of injury or illness will be required for a refund. Bitches which come in season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. There will be no refunds for entries in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal or misses their scheduled runs.

WARNING!

Please keep your dog on leash, at all times other than when preparing to run, running or using a designated area for dogs off leash. Please clean up after yourself and your dog.

Keep your dogs out of the areas marked by "No Dogs" signs or designated as non dog areas at the briefing. This should generally include biking and riding paths around the facility, facility bathrooms, and landscaped areas, etc. Common sense should prevail.

DOCNA insurance rules: In the event of incident at the Contact Zonies training facility, If a situation arises, DOCNA requires that the owner of the dog; report the incident to the show committee.

COLLARS IN THE RING

March 2, 2015 – Collars will be permitted on the course only in the following circumstances:

- **Outdoor trials – BEGINNER LEVEL CLASSES ONLY (Collar must have appropriate ID on it) – See rules attached**

TRAINING DEVICES

The following devices are not allowed at the trial site: shock collars, bark collars, pinch collars, electronic training/collar devices.

DAILY FEES AND PACKAGE RATES FOR THE TRIAL

STANDARD - \$12 per run, STRATEGIC OR TRADITIONAL GAMBERS - \$12 per run SNAKES ' N LADDERS - \$12 per run

JUMPERS - \$10 per run TRIGILITY - \$7 per competitor

Junior Handler runs are \$6 per run

Weekend (2 Day) Package: \$90 first dog, \$80 second and subsequent dogs (does not include the NAC run)

Junior Handler Weekend Package \$50 per dog (does not include the NAC run)

North America Challenge - \$18.00 (\$10 for Junior Handlers) (separate from weekend package)

The North America Challenge Event will be the standard for qualification into future championships. This is a special agility run that is scored under the same rules as Standard Agility. North America Challenge Events will be more technically challenging courses. Each course will include 1 set of 10-12 weaves and may include an additional set of 5-6 weaves for all levels. In addition, courses may include the performance of 4 contact obstacles, multiple side changes, and additional discriminations. There is no Beginner level for the NAC, competitors at the lower training levels should enter the Intern level.

PRE CHECK-IN

IF you include a readable photocopy of your dog's DOCNA measurement form that has been completed by a DOCNA Judge or a DOCNA permanent height card with your entry; you **will** be automatically checked in as far as the measurement. You will need to still check in, so the trial can confirm your presence.

This does NOT apply to dogs that need to be measured.

MOVE UPS

After submitting your entry form, we will accept move-ups or changes up until 30 minutes before the start of the trial day. This includes if there are any changes that need to be made because of incorrect entry on trial secretary's part. Please **read** your confirmations carefully.

REFUNDS

There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal.

A withdrawal from the competition after the closing date due to an injury and/or illness will be eligible for a refund of up to 100%. A withdrawal due to a bitch coming into season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. A veterinarian's notice of injury or illness will be required for a refund.

No entry fee refunded if the trial cannot open or completed by reasons of riots, civil disturbances, fire an act of God, public emergency and act of public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Prior to filling out the entry, the following information should help in determining the level and division which you wish to compete in the North America Challenge.

North America Challenge Event – Championship Qualifiers - The North America Challenge Event will be the standard for qualification into future championships. This is a special agility run that is scored under the same rules and SCT as Standard Agility with the exception that off courses are judged as

elimination. North America Challenge Events will be more technically challenging courses. Each course will include 1 set of 10-12 weaves and may include an additional set of 5-6 weaves for all levels. In addition, courses may include the performance of 4 contact obstacles, multiple side changes, and additional discriminations.

The North America Challenge is a special event which gives the handler and dog team the opportunity to compete in the DOCNA championships. For anyone entering the North America Challenge, Dogs that are competing in Standard Agility at the Elite Level in Nadac, Masters in USDAA, Excellent in AKC, etc, must enter the North America Challenge at the Specialist Level in the Division they are choosing to run in Competition, Select, Veteran, Jr. Handler or Grand Veterans.

All other competitors should enter at the Intern Level (this includes beginners)

The handler will then *enter the Division they are choosing to run in Competition, Select, Veteran, Jr. Handler or Grand Veterans at the Intern level.*

- ✓ **Competition Division** - (Specialist Level has double jumps and may contain a triple jump, Intern Level may contain a double jump, fastest time)
- ✓ **Select Division** - (Specialist Level has double jumps, Intern Level may contain a ascending double jump – 10% more time than competition - jumps lower then (Competition).
- ✓ **Veteran Division** - (dog over 7 or handler over 60) – NO double jumps – 15% more time than competition
- ✓ **Jr. Handler** – (please visit www.docna.com for age requirements) - NO double jumps – 15% more time than competition
- ✓ **Grand Veteran** - (dog over 10) or (handler over 60 and dog over 7) - NO double jumps – 20% more time than competition. jumps lower than Veterans

Snakes 'N Ladders and Trigility:

All dogs must start at the Beginner level in the Snakes 'N Ladders and Trigility Events.

It is agreed that the laws of Arizona shall govern interpretation of this Agreement,

I (We) agree that DOCNA or the hosting group for this trial, has the right to refuse this entry for any cause, which the organizing committee alone shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, of the holding of the event and of the opportunity to have the dog participate and/or to be judged, I (we) acknowledge that:

- 1.1 As used here DOCNA means Dogs On Course in North America, LLC, its owners, rule committee, members, officers, employees, show chairs, show committees and agents. Handlers/Competitors/Exhibitors/Owners, agree to abide by the rules and regulations of DOCNA and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event
- 1.2 I (we) agree to hold DOCNA and hosting group for this trial (including their owners, employees, members, officers, directors, and organizing committee), Dogs On Course in North America, LLC (DOCNA) including its owners, rule committee, members, officers, directors, agents and employees, sponsors of the event, owners of premises upon which the event is held, and their employees, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or upon the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim. The person who signs this agreement represents that he/she is authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of both exhibitor and the owner of entered dog. In consideration of acceptance of this entry:

Any competitor/exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may, at the discretion of the Trial/Show/ Committee be asked to leave the show site. March 2, 2015 – Collars, WITH APPROPRIATE ID, will be permitted on course only in the following circumstances:

- Outdoor trials – **Beginner level classes only**
- Under special circumstances a handler not in beginner events may approach the Judge to ask for permission to use an appropriate collar – Judges discretion

The purpose in allowing collars in the ring is designed to assist the handler in finding their dog should it escape or wander off from the agility trial.

For safety reasons, all competitors in the Beginner events are encouraged to run their dogs without a collar. For those who choose to run with a collar, a quick release collar is suggested. Flat or rolled collars with a buckle or plastic release clasp made of fabric or leather are also acceptable designs.

It is mandatory that any collar worn in the ring have appropriate owner contact info (phone number at a minimum) Acceptable identification examples include an info plaque riveted flat against the collar or info stitched into the collar. It is also acceptable to use tag bags that contain license tags and owner information on a collar as long as it fits securely on the collar.

Collars without acceptable contact info will not be allowed in the ring. Collars with dangling tags, martingale type loops, halters, gentle leaders, harnesses and any electronic training devices (shock, bark, pinch, citronella, etc.) will not be allowed in the ring. Any dog that runs with an unacceptable collar will be eliminated from the run.

Should a judge feel that a collar does not fall within DOCNA standards or is otherwise unsafe, they will have the authority to request that the exhibitor remove it from the dog or not run.

Infractions

- At no time should a collar be used as a training device at the start line, nor should the dog be dragged to the line by the collar, from the course, or back to an obstacle during training in the ring.
- At no time should a collar be purposely used to hold the dog's front feet up off the ground while entering or leaving the course or to lead a dog back to an obstacle during training in the ring
- The handler's hand should be free and clear of the collar prior to starting the run
- Competitors may not use a collar as a holding device, bowling the dog to start by holding the collar
- In Trigrity, once the dog is finished, you are welcome to hold this collar in a positive manner

Faults and Elimination

- Any competitor that uses a collar in an unacceptable way will receive a minimum of 5 faults, but may also be eliminated from the run
- At the judge's discretion, any competitor that uses a collar in an unacceptable way while training in the ring (after the run has been eliminated) may be eliminated for the rest of the day or the weekend depending on the severity of the infraction
- Any dog that runs with an unacceptable collar will be eliminated from the run

Measurement Form/Permanent Height Cards

Competitors must complete the requirements of the measurement form as stated below and may use this form at each trial as an alternative to applying for a permanent height card. A completed measurement form is all that is required to present at check in. **ALL** dogs must complete the measurement requirements or continue to be measured at **EVERY** trial.

A measurement form should be completed as follows:

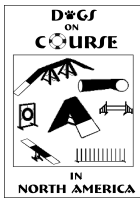
- If your dog is measured at under ½ inch or more from the cut off and is over 2 years of age, the judge will sign your form as complete and you may use this form at check in or apply for a permanent height card.
- If your dog measures in at ½ inch or less from official cut off, you must obtain three (3) judge's measurements that state the exact height measured height of the dog. If your dog is over 2 years of age, you may use this form at check in or apply for a permanent height card.
- For dogs that measure in the top height category (over 22") the judge will sign your form as complete and you may use this form at check in or apply for a permanent height card.
- Dogs that complete measurements prior to turning two years of age should wait and obtain the 3rd measurement after they turn two years of age, at which time the judge will sign your form as complete and you may use this measurement form at check in or apply for a permanent height card. Prior to turning two, you may still use this form with two (2) signatures at check in.

DOCNA does not have specifically designated measuring judges; any judge can sign a measuring form.

Acceptance of Jump Height Documentation from other organizations towards a DOCNA completed measurement form (for dogs over two years of age) – pick one option only:

- Option 1: DOCNA will accept for dogs over 2 years of age a copy of any **jump height form, card, or database subscriber information** from other organizations (multiple organizations may be combined) that specify the measured height of the dog (example 20.75 inches). The competitor will bring the above information along with a DOCNA measurement form to measure in, **the judge will fill out the form with the information supplied (no measurement will be required)**. The competitor may choose to use this completed form at future check in or apply for a permanent height card. The competitor may choose to use this completed form at future check in or apply for a permanent height card.
- Option 2: Any dog over 2 years of age competing in a particular jump height that has a USDAA, NADAC, AAC, AKC or CPE permanent jump height card that does not specify a exact measured height may submit this card or a copy of this card at measurement and will require one (1) measurement from a DOCNA judge towards a DOCNA completed measurement form. Note that dogs less than 2 years old will not be able to choose this option.

A completed measurement form is all that is required to present at check in. However, should a competitor wish to apply for a permanent height card, they may send in a copy of their completed measurement form and the fee for the permanent height card, which is \$10.00, which covers the cost of the card, including processing, printing and postage and handling fees. Replacement cards will be issued at a cost of \$10.00 per card.
